Most frogs are nocturnal, so you're more likely to spot them at night



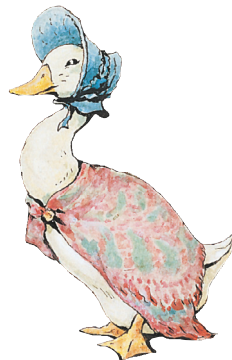
SQUIRREL NUTKIN
