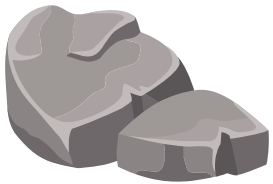


Become a smarty pants and learn all about natural art and the importance of recycling with these fascinating facts

SPIRAL JETTY

Artist Robert Smithson used 6,000 tons of basalt rocks to create spinning spiral art out into Utah's Great Salt Lake



ANDY GOLDWORTHY

Andy uses stone, sand, water, leaves, flowers, ice, snow, feathers, animal bone, and even animal dung to create outdoor art!

TREE CARVING

The world's longest wood carving was made from one single tree trunk. It's over 12 meters long - that's even longer than a whale shark!

PLASTIC

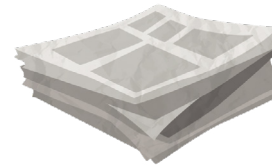
Around 8 million pieces of plastic end up in the ocean every day
